This year marks
a decade of soft
plastic collections in
New Zealand. We now
have over 320 public
drop off bins and 100
member collection
points.

Since November 2015, we have diverted over **3470** tonnes of soft plastic from landfill with **90%** recycled here in New Zealand (from 2019 onwards). Since 2019, the equivalent of **480** million bags or wrappers have been reprocessed in New Zealand. That's a huge achievement.

## JANUARY SUMMER RECYCLING AT THE BEACH

About 370,000 overseas visitors came to New Zealand in January. Soft plastic recycling is available for both tourists and Kiwis alike at popular summer destinations across the North and South Islands, including the Bay of Islands, Coromandel, Gisborne, Hawke's Bay, Queenstown Lakes, Marlborough, Nelson, Tasman, and Akaroa.





## FEBRUARY IMPROVING DATA ACCURACY

An audit of 415 bags of soft plastic collected from stores across Auckland, Hamilton, Tauranga, Wellington and Christchurch found the average weight of a bag is 5.48kg. The bags were then baled with the average bale weight recorded at each collection site.

#### MARCH OUT & ABOUT

At the Foodstuffs Expo, visitors saw Manco's new soft plastic compactor bins, which increase 240-litre bin capacity from 5.4kg to over 30kg of soft plastic. A space and time saving innovation! ## APRIL CONGRATULATIONS TO FUTURE POST

Supreme Winner of the 2025 Port Marlborough Environment Awards

Future Post was honoured with the Wine Industry Category Award. They also received the Supreme Award for their innovative approach to recycling plastic waste into sturdy products for agriculture and infrastructure.

#### MAY

#### OVERWHELMING SUPPORT FROM HOUSEHOLDS PARTICIPATING IN THE KERBSIDE COLLECTION TRIAL IN NELSON

The trial saw the collection of 7,841 orange bags, which weighed a total of 4,327 kgs — roughly equal to recycling 660,000 bags or wrappers from 1000 participating households. Feedback gathered from 74% of participants showed strong support for continuing the program. Additionally, 98% of those respondents expressed interest in another trial focused on collection through the council's collection bin.

Future Post also launched their new range of square posts and rails into Mitre 10 Blenheim.

## JUNE PANTRY ITEMS AND BREAD BAGS ARE THE MOST RECYCLED SOFT PLASTICS

Sunshine Yates Consulting conducted the 6th annual soft plastic audit to identify the soft plastic packaging most recycled by consumers. Most material categories stayed relatively consistent over time (e.g., 'Bread bags' ranged from 5.7% to 8.2% in six years).

#### CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF SOFT PLASTIC RECYCLING AND THAT 87% NEW ZEALANDERS HAVE ACCESS TO A SOFT PLASTIC RECYCLING BIN

In the past year, we reprocessed more than 988 tonnes of soft plastic—equal to 150 million bags and wrappers—producing 100,000 posts, enough to fence 520 km from Wairarapa to Waiuku. Soft plastic is sent to Future Post (Waiuku and Blenheim) or saveBOARD (Hamilton) for processing.
